

DIES AT HOME ALONE.

E. R. Weethee, Whose Wife Was Drowned During Flood, Is Victim of Heart Trouble.

E. R. Weethee, aged 62, formerly an engineer at the Lenox hotel, and who made his home there a part of the time, died in his cottage on Clinder lane, Marlon township, some time early Saturday. He was found dead by Mrs. Barbara Ables, a neighbor, at noon Saturday, and Coroner Benkert was notified. The coroner believes that the man died of heart trouble. He has a daughter somewhere in Columbus.

Until three weeks ago he had lived at the Lenox hotel, but being out of employment since then, he had gone to live at the cottage in the country which he owned. His wife lost her life in the flood of March, 1913, and since that time he had lived alone.
